Chairman Charles H. Odegaard announced June 12th 701 meeting; announced Parks and Outdoor Recreation Seminar, reviewed history, described invitation list.

Kruger moved endorsement of Mr. Odegaard's commitment of Inter-Agency Committee in sponsoring Seminar and offers assistance of each agency.

Seconded by Val Rinehart. Approved.

The work to be performed by Inter-Agency Committee was discussed:

1. Passage of Initiative 215 will establish Inter-Agency Committee under law.
2. Need cited for coordinated action on problems and programs outlined in Governor's Report on Outdoor Recreation.

It was suggested that each department's plans for specific recreational developments be reviewed. Subject priorities were listed:

1. Finances - all state agencies be prepared for passage of Initiative 215 and Referendum Bill No. 11.

2. Need for coordination between agencies on legislation at 1965 session of Legislature.
3. Plans for coordination and cooperation among agencies.
4. Consideration of ongoing current problems at each Inter-Agency Committee meeting.

Bigley moves. Seconded by Knott that Parker be secretary to Inter-Agency Committee. Approved.

Next meetings were set for June 25, July 9, and second Thursday each month thereafter.

It was suggested that each agency always have two persons attend each meeting.

Need for Inter-Agency letterhead was cited.
