SUBJECT: **Clarifying the Order of Projects Transferred to the Riparian
Protection Category of WWRP**

The purpose of this special meeting is to clarify the rank order of the seven projects transferred to the Riparian category at the September 21-22, 2006 IAC meeting, and if necessary, amend one or both of the actions transferring the seven projects.

Background

At its September 21 and 22, 2006, meeting, the IAC approved a list of projects for each of the eleven Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP) categories, to be submitted to the Governor by November 1. The Committee observed that if WWRP were to receive the requested \$100 million appropriation in the 2007-09 capital budget, there would be excess funds available in the Riparian Protection and Farmland Preservation categories.

To utilize the possible excess funding in the Riparian Protection category, the Committee decided to transfer four projects from the Urban Wildlife Habitat category, two from the Critical Habitat category, and one from the Natural Areas category to the Riparian Protection category. The seven projects are listed in Table A. Staff analysis demonstrated that each of these seven projects meet the eligibility criteria for the Riparian category and that these projects would not receive full funding in their original categories at the requested \$100 million appropriation.

Transferring the seven projects to the Riparian category was done in two separate actions. On the first day of the meeting, an amendment to the motion for Resolution 2006-28 (approving the list of Critical Habitat projects) transferred the Methow Riparian-Phase 5 project to the Riparian category.

On the second day of the meeting, a motion was made to adopt Resolution 2006-31, approving the list of Riparian Protection projects. An amendment to the motion transferred three additional projects to the Riparian category: Lower Union River Estuary Acquisition, Beaver Lake Preserve Expansion, and Methow Riparian-Phase 5. Two additional amendments transferred the four additional projects.

To help the Committee decide how to rank the projects transferred to the Riparian category, staff provided a statistical method (Z-scores) to compare the evaluation scores for projects from different categories. Table A shows the seven projects ranked using this method. The table with the projects ranked by z-scores was projected on a screen when the Committee discussed and took the action to add the seven projects to the Riparian category. The motion and series of amendments included verbally listing the projects in that order.

Analysis of transcripts of the meeting shows that this action taken on the second day of the meeting may have been inconsistent with the action taken on the first day. The action on the first day appears to have placed the Methow project as the very next project on the Riparian list—project 18 (see Attachment 8, Table 1a). However, the action on the second day appears to have placed the Methow third among the projects transferred to the Riparian list, or project number 20 (Attachment 9, Table 1b).

Recommended IAC Action

Clarify the rank order of the seven projects transferred to the Riparian category and amend one or both previously taken actions accordingly. Staff will provide recommended wording for the necessary motions.
