SOLE SOURCE POSTING

The Recreation and Conservation Office contemplates awarding a sole source contract to University of Georgia Center for Invasive Species and Ecosystem Health to provide WA Invasive mobile invasive species reporting app updates and integration of WA Invasives application into the University's Early Detection and Distribution MAPPING System (EDDMAPS).

The scope of work for this contract is as follows:

1. Improve WA Invasives mobile reporting app for Android and iOS integration into Early Detection and Distribution MAPPING System (EDDMAPS) national database.
2. Create and deploy twenty (20) additional invasive species reporting profiles for new Washington Invasive Species Council priority species.
3. Improve WA Invasives mobile reporting app interfaces.
4. Design and deploy EDMAPS integration to Washington Invasive Species Council online reporting form.
5. Improve functionality and content of WA Invasives mobile reporting app for Android and iOS.

The contract will be issued on or about September 26, 2017 for 10 months with options for a 12 month extension, depending on additional funding. The dollar value is estimated at fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) during the anticipated 10 month period.

Offerors contemplating the above requirements are required to submit capability statements detailing their ability to meet the state's requirements within five (5) calendar days of this announcement being posted. The following information should be included in the capability statements: 1) Knowledge and experience with Early Detection and Distribution MAPPING System (EDDMAPS) database design, data, and communications protocols; 2) Knowledge and experience with WA Invasive mobile reporting app coding and services for Android (Washington Invasives (Beta)) and iOS (WA Invasives version 3.0).

In the absence of other qualified sources, it is the state's intent to make a sole source award of the contract.
