Washington Trails Association **\$75,000**

Providing Volunteers for Trail Maintenance Statewide

The Washington Trails Association will use this grant to maintain more than 80 trails across the state, in locations ranging from the north Cascade Mountains and Okanogan Highlands to the southern Washington coast and Columbia River Gorge. The association's focus is on trails that provide outstanding day hikes and family friendly outings. Crews will remove downed trees, trim overgrown bushes, and repair trail surfaces and drainage structures. The association will contribute \$316,250 in donations of cash and labor. (09-1197)

Washington Department of Natural Resources **\$74,450**

Maintaining the Walker Valley Off-Road Vehicle Area

The Washington Department of Natural Resources will use this grant to hire a trail manager to help maintain the 36-mile, 6,000-acre Walker Valley off-road vehicle trail system. Crews will shape and harden trail surfaces, install and fix drainage structures, inspect and maintain bridges, and trim overgrown bushes. They also will pick up garbage and maintain outhouses, picnic areas, bulletin boards, and signs. The department will contribute \$53,600 in equipment, materials, labor, and donations of equipment and labor. (09-1004)

Washington Trails Association **\$75,000**

Supporting Backcountry Trail Teams

The Washington Trails Association will use this grant to maintain backcountry hiking and equestrian trails. Crews will reconstruct turnpikes, remove downed trees, and fix drainage structures. The grant will pay for more than 60 backcountry trail teams who will maintain 50 trails, totaling more than 100 miles, using more than 13,000 hours of donated labor. Work will be done in Washington's five national forests, three national parks, and state parks. The association will contribute \$245,800 in donations of cash and labor. (09-1192)

U.S. Forest Service, Wenatchee National Forest, Chelan Ranger District **\$75,000**

Maintaining the Chelan Uplake Trail

The Chelan Ranger District will use this grant to maintain 190 miles of trails in the district and portions of the Glacier Peak and Lake Chelan-Sawtooth Wilderness areas, the Sawtooth roadless area, the Lucerne-Holden Village Scenic Corridor, and the Domke Lake roadless area. Crews will remove downed trees and loose rock, fix drainage structures, trim overgrown bushes, rebuild trail surfaces, repair signs and bulletin boards, and repair bridges. The Forest Service will contribute \$61,975 in equipment, labor, and donations of equipment and labor. (09-1071)

Hurricane Ridge Education Foundation **\$20,000**
Grooming Hurricane Ridge Trails

The Hurricane Ridge Education Foundation will use this grant to groom 10 miles of Nordic and alpine trails for two years near Hurricane Ridge in the Olympic National Park. The mountain trails will help beginners and intermediate skiers tackle the terrain, give the Hurricane Ridge Ski Team a place to train, and provide a route for visitors to get to the backcountry. In 2006, 32 miles of wilderness trails were damaged severely by the Tinpan Fire and the district expects more fallen trees, trail erosion and damaged trail surfaces as the dead trees fall. Work would include clearing of culverts, repairing minor trail wash-outs and maintaining 250 signs and route safety markers. Replacing the West Fork Foss Trail Bridge

The Skykomish Ranger District will use this grant to build .2 mile of trail and a 90-foot-long trail bridge over the west fork of the Foss River, upstream from the bridges that washed out in the 2006 flood. This project will restore access to the 7-mile-long West Fork Foss Trail, which runs near an old-growth forest, scenic vistas and five large subalpine lakes. The old bridges were in a braided flood plain and were damaged in floods. The new bridge site is upstream of this flood prone area at a well-defined river channel with stable riverbanks. This trail is one of the most popular within the heavily used Alpine Lakes Wilderness, and this bridge is needed to restore access. Historically, this trail provided a backcountry experience for more than 5,000 day and overnight users annually, but with the bridges out and a hazardous river ford required, use has dropped to less than 100. This project will provide a safe, long-term crossing. The Forest Service will contribute \$112,750 in cash and donated labor. (09-1195)

Building the Evergreen Park Trailhead

Kittitas County will use this grant to complete preliminary design, site preparation and the first phase of construction of a multi-use trailhead and park on land south of Cle Elum. Work will include completing final design and engineering, preparing the site and installing fences, gates, signs and a temporary restroom. Phase 1 development is intended to make the trailhead useable for winter recreation. The project will provide parking for 50-60 vehicles with snowmobile trailers. The 5-acre site adjoins Forest Service Road #4510, which becomes a groomed snowmobile trail in the winter and connects to the Taneum/Manashtash, south Cle Elum and Easton areas.
