## Help Make a Difference

Every year, the state Recreation and Conservation Office works with more than 100 volunteers, who provide important advice on grant policies and funding.

Participation helps to ensure that the funding process remains fair, and that public dollars are spent only on the best projects.

Volunteers are divided among more than two dozen advisory committees, project evaluation teams, and technical review panels. Membership includes the public, agency professionals, and recreationists.

Advisory committees provide:

Grant Scoring

Evaluators review applications and score them, creating ranked lists that are the foundation for funding recommendations.

• Policy Advice

Volunteers may give advice on grant program goals and objectives, state plans, evaluation questions, eligibility criteria, and cost increases.

• Project Technical Review

Volunteers coach applicants on ways to improve projects before evaluations.

For many of RCO's committees, charter documents are available that detail administration, duties, pay, membership, attributes, and other information.

Boating Programs Advisory Committee	Evaluates grants to acquire, develop, and renovate facilities for motorized boats.
Environmental Education	
No Child Left Inside	Evaluates grants that fund outdoor environmental, ecological, agricultural, or other natural resource-based education and recreation programs serving youth.
Farmland Preservation	
Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program Farmland Preservation Advisory Committee	Evaluates grants for farmland preservation through voluntary land preservation.
Forestland Preservation	
Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program Forestland Preservation Advisory Committee	Evaluates grants for forestland preservation through voluntary land preservation.
Firearms and Archery Ranges	
Firearms and Archery Range Recreation Advisory Committee	Evaluates grants to acquire, develop, and renovate public and private nonprofit firearm range and archery training and practice facilities.
