Legislative Updates

- State budget overview
 - Riparian Habitat Protection and Restoration = \$123 M
 - Clean Water = \$9.4 M
 - Low Flows and Cold Water = \$6.7 M
 - Harvest, Monitoring, and Enforcement = \$27 M
 - Hatchery Improvements = \$7.0 M
 - Hydropower Impacts = \$5.9 M
 - Fish Passage Programs = \$650 K
 - Science = \$3.1 M
 - Accountability and Adaptive Management = \$3.3 M

SRNet & Governor's Strategy

- Governor's Strategy Priorities:
 - Protect and restore vital salmon habitat
 - Invest in clean water infrastructure for salmon and people
 - Correct fish passage barriers and restore salmon access to historical habitat
 - Build climate resiliency
 - Align harvest, hatcheries, and hydropower with salmon recovery
 - Address predation and food web issues for salmon
 - Enhance commitments and coordination across agencies and programs
 - Strengthen science, monitoring, and accountability
