Lakewood Refreshing Harry Todd Park

The City of Lakewood will use this grant to maintain amenities at Harry Todd Park, a seventeen-acre lakefront park in the Tillicum neighborhood. The park features playfields, tennis and basketball courts, and picnic shelters. The lakefront area is the only public access to open water in this geographically and economically isolated community. The City will apply a protective seal coat striping to pavements to provide a layer of protection, paint and stripe the basketball courts, fill potholes and add material to level the gravel parking lot, add wood chips to the playground to prevent injuries, and hire seasonal staff to address maintenance needs.
