Our Role

The Governor's Salmon Recovery Office, part of the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office, coordinates salmon and orca recovery for the state to ensure a future with abundant salmon, healthy orcas, and restored lands and waterways that can adjust to a changing climate.

Areas of Focus

Governor's Salmon Strategy: Maintain the Governor's statewide plan to recover salmon. Convene the Natural Resources Subcabinet to make sure budgets and priorities work together for salmon.

Southern Resident Orca Recovery: Coordinate recovery for the state focused on increasing food, quieting waters, and reducing pollution.

Regional Recovery Plans: Support regional partners in developing and executing their federally approved salmon recovery plans.

Biennial Report: Create the *State of Salmon in Watersheds* report, which describes the health of Washington's salmon populations and recovery efforts.

Riparian Habitat: Coordinate efforts by state agencies to restore and protect land along waterways (riparian habitat) and create other habitat policies.

Science and Monitoring: Guide salmon science and monitoring programs and priorities for the Salmon Recovery Funding Board, state agencies, and partners.

Collaboration: Partner with local, state, federal, and Tribal governments and others to advance salmon and orca recovery.

Communication: Share the importance of salmon and orca recovery to a wide audience and help partners with outreach efforts.
