Marvin Thomas Memorial

Grant Awarded: \$25,000

Launching the Exploring Heritage through Nature Program

The Marvin Thomas Memorial will use this grant to expand its G.R.O.W. (Girls Removing Obstacles Worldwide) program by adding an outdoor component called Exploring Heritage through Nature. The grant will pay for camping, materials, transportation, food, and staff for a year-long program for fifteen Black and Brown girls from southeast Seattle, ages eleven to seventeen. The girls will participate in outdoor activities including a camping trip at Millersylvania State Park, day trips to Dash Point State Park, and seasonal urban hikes at Seward Park. These outdoor experiences will feature hiking, swimming, cultural storytelling around a fire pit, the outdoor national award-winning Traveling Museum, and family-based nature activities. The program aims to instill a sense of heritage, self-confidence, and a love of the outdoors, connecting girls with their community and cultural roots while enjoying Washington's natural spaces. CORE Health

Grant Awarded: \$24,207

Expanding the ASCENT Youth Center Outdoor Activities Program

CORE Health will use this grant to expand its day camps that offer hiking, swimming, and kayaking to homeless youth. The grant will pay for supplies such as fishing poles, compasses, safety whistles, books, and life jackets. It also will pay for facility rentals, food, transportation, staff, and staff training. CORE Health is a behavioral health agency in Cowlitz County that provides recreational activities to youth during spring and summer breaks. CORE Health partners with Community House on Broadway, a homeless shelter, to host day camps for 125 school-aged youth. Innovative Change Makers Outdoor Activities with Purpose

Grant Awarded: \$74,330

The Innovative Change Makers will use this grant for its Outdoor Activities with Purpose program, which will offer adventures for one hundred youth. The grant will pay for staff, transportation, travel, gear, and supply costs. Mentoring Urban Students & Teens Expanding Outdoor Programming for Black Males

Grant Awarded: \$99,500

Mentoring Urban Students & Teens (M.U.S.T.) will use this grant for staff, transportation, food, and supplies to expand its outdoor education and recreation program for high school-age Black males living in Seattle. The program serves about forty-five youth a year, offering mentorship, life skills workshops, college and career readiness, and outdoor experiences that aim to broaden participant's ideas of who they are and what they can achieve while helping them define for themselves their place in the world. The grant will help expand the outdoor education and recreation curriculum to include a quarterly outing during the school year where participants will backpack, rock climb, boat, fish, and snowshoe or snowboard, and learn about the salmon life cycle. In the summer, two outings will take participants on camping trips to learn survival skills and about the Pacific Northwest ecology. Seattle Expanding Outdoor and Career Explorations for Youth

Grant Awarded: \$112,364

The Seattle Parks and Recreation Department will use this grant to expand and improve its free program—Support the Outdoor Activation and Mobile Recreation Career Explorations: Into the Wild program—that serves about 180 youth a year. The grant will allow the program to add two camping trips in each of its cohorts for two years and introduce participants to kayaking, hiking, fishing, and adventure activities. The career explorations program offers mentorship and internships to youth ages fifteen to twenty-one who are interested in parks and recreation jobs. Through weekly workshops, social-emotional learning activities, and mentorships, they explore what each career entails. When completed, most participants are offered paid internships in Seattle parks programs. A second program, Queer Quest, provides small group workshops for youth navigating issues faced by their gender identities. A third program, Girls Go Green (Triple G) provides monthly workshops and labs in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math), concentrating on environmental sciences, alternative energy, and engineering. A fourth program, Sea Star, is a new program that will focus on strengthening the family dynamic for middle school youth who are struggling with social-emotional learning. include youth mentorship and summer camps targeting remote communities on the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation in north central Washington. The program provides education for Tribal, Black, and Youth of Color on the reservation. Environmental Ambassadors will serve seventy youth in ninth through twelfth grades and 120 youth in sixth through eighth grades, in two years. The goals of the program are to encourage vocational interest in natural resources, ecological conservation, and restoration; to provide opportunities for mentorship from elders, cultural knowledge keepers, and community partners; to provide immersive curriculum that promotes holistic and interdisciplinary approaches to learning with an emphasis on the intersections of traditional ecological knowledge and mainstream science; and to implement a youth mentorship module that cultivates leadership skills for Environmental Ambassador participants. Camp Beausite Northwest

Grant Awarded: \$112,500

Expanding the Nature for All: Respite Camp for Disabilities

Camp Beausite Northwest will use this grant for staff, food, and transportation for camps for four hundred people with disabilities from around Washington State. The fully accessible camp in Chimacum offers programs throughout the year for campers with intellectual and physical disabilities, aged eight to twenty-five. The grant will provide campers with up to 116 hours a week of outdoor camp experience, including nature exploration, adaptive sports, creative and performing arts, and environmental education. Cattail Rising

Grant Awarded: \$112,500

Expanding an Inter-Tribal Youth Traditional Food Program

Cattail Rising will use this grant to expand its Inter-Tribal Youth Program into a free, year-round initiative, serving two regions in Washington: the westside, primarily for students from South Puget Sound Tribes, and the eastside, mainly for students from the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation. This program will offer about forty high school-aged youth and their families a STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and math) curriculum that is land-based, Tribally centered, and led by Native educators. About 80 percent of participating youth qualify for free and reduced lunch. Through this grant, the Inter-Tribal Program will gather youth four times a year in each region for intensive day trips that incorporate wilderness safety, first aid, and seasonally focused food and medicine gathering in diverse environment. Youth also will learn traditional preservation techniques to create traditional first aid kits. Each summer, youth from both regions will come together for a two-day Academy Camp, where they can exchange cultural knowledge, foods, and traditions. The grant will support staffing,
