### Thurston County Building the Gate-Belmore Trail

The Thurston County Public Works Department will use this grant to develop a 2.16-mile gravel trail on a decommissioned railroad line between 88th Avenue Southwest and 66th Avenue Southwest in Olympia. The trail will be used for non-motorized recreation such as running, walking, and nature viewing in an area where few trails exist. The trail will run through a prairie, wetland, and forest and one trailhead is near the Kennydell Park entrance. The County will replace two decaying creosote timber trestle bridges with modern, single-span structures to improve wetland connectivity and water quality. The County also may add lights, signs, and striping to improve the safety of trail users. The work will benefit priority species such as wood ducks, cutthroat trout, and the Oregon spotted frog, which is a species listed as threatened with extinction under the federal Endangered Species Act. ## King County Grant Requested: 3,469,100 Developing Lakeland North Urban Nature Park

King County will use this grant to buy about twenty-two acres, complete habitat restoration, and develop a neighborhood park. The park will include picnic areas, a natural playground, parking, paved walkways, soft-surface trails, signs, restroom, and utilities. #### Seattle Grant Requested: \$350,962 Renovating Be'er Sheva Park

The Seattle Parks and Recreation Department will use this grant to renovate Be'er Sheva Park. This community-led project will use the grant to install a fitness zone, a lit walking loop pathway, play equipment, resilient surfacing, and landscaping. #### Seattle Grant Requested: 2,085,000 Renovating the Garfield Super Block

The Seattle Parks and Recreation Department will use this grant to renovate the Garfield Super Block. This community-led project will use the grant to install site furnishings, improve access for people with disabilities, add play equipment and nature play, upgrade restrooms and a picnic area, and add a circular pathway with lighting. In addition, the City will add a formal Parkour element and a bouldering climbing wall; reconfigure a multi-court area; resurface basketball, pickleball, and tennis courts; and make landscaping improvements throughout.
